Job Description

Mental Health Colorado is the state's leading advocate for the prevention and treatment of mental illness. We are a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization and an affiliate of Mental Health America.

We seek a skilled and proficient Grant Writer to support our development functions. Responsible for writing proposals for both unrestricted operating revenue and restricted projects and for submitting timely and accurate reports for all existing grant funded projects.

Responsibilities include:

- Conduct the full range of activities required to prepare, submit, and manage grant proposals to foundation and corporate sources
- Perform prospect research on foundations and corporations to evaluate prospects for corporate and foundation grants
- Maintain annual grants calendar to include new application and reporting deadlines
- Work with finance to gather information necessary to report to corporate/foundation funders on current grant programs
- Comply with all grant reporting as required by foundation/corporate donors
- Make appointments for Director of Development with foundation officers and other prospects
- Maintain current records in database and in paper files, including grant tracking and reporting
- Work with Director of Development to provide development input for all written institutional materials (i.e. annual report, donor newsletter)
- Assist with other fundraising projects as requested

- Strong editing skills excellent spelling and grammar
